Robust, fit for purpose visual displays key to showcase fire station

The Customer

The fully volunteer Edithvale Fire Brigade of 100+ members is one of over 1200 brigades within Victoria's Country Fire Authority (CFA). It not only responds to fires and emergencies within its own immediate assignment area, the Brigade also contributes to larger firefighting and emergency operations in Victoria and interstate when required. This includes the provision of emergency medical response to critically ill patients in support of Ambulance Victoria. Proceeds from extensive Brigade fundraising and bipartisan government support secured the \$4.5million funding to design, build and fit out a new three storey facility, with centralised communications room, at Edithvale.

The Challenges

The project was future focussed as a showcase for best practice emergency service provisioning and resourcing.

A purpose built Volunteer Business Hub and community co-working space was incorporated for Brigade meeting, administrative, training and community group use. The modern business environment of the new facility allows volunteers - on whom the organisation depends - to perform their regular work duties or study while on standby.

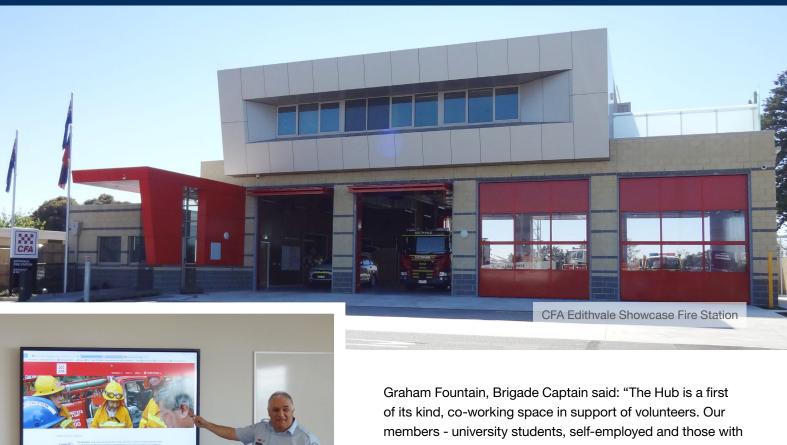

A range of visual displays was required to facilitate these various operational, training, business and other collaborative activities.

In assessing available technologies, the weighting was for robust, reliable and cost effective offerings in terms of total cost of ownership. The Brigade elected to invest in commercial grade equipment that would be reliable under 24/7 continuous operation and over a long life.

The placement of the screens in the critical operational areas - conveying to all crews the vital incident details, address, maps, weather, response times and other dispatch information - would be open to the elements and in high traffic areas which required them to have industrial level toughness.

For the visual displays installed in training rooms, the Hub and other community areas, the focus was on collaboration and communication capabilities.

Captain Fountain said: "We were looking for technology partners with a shared ethos in creating safer communities and proven understanding of the emergency management space."



The Solution

From the due diligence process, NEC was selected to supply 18 displays screens ranging from 32, 40, 70 and 84 inch to match Edithvale's use, resolution, audio, live streaming and mounting requirements.

The high impact displays were placed strategically and sized appropriately in operations control, change room and other operational areas to provide vision everywhere the volunteers are as they prepare for action.
